

Types of Abuse You May Recognize.

Physical Abuse:

Bruises, unexplained injuries, rough treatment, inappropriate use of dugs or physical restraints, or a caregiver's refusal to allow visitation of the vulnerable adult without their supervision may be signs of physical abuse.



Sexual Abuse:

Bruises around the breasts or genital area, unwanted or inappropriate sexual behavior, or unexplained Venerable Disease or genital infections can indicate sexual abuse.



Neglect:

Look for dirty, unkempt appearance, inappropriate clothing for the season and poor nourishment. Unclean or unsafe living conditions, or ignoring the needs of a victim either medically or physically are additional indicators of criminal neglect.

Emotional Abuse:

Withdrawal from normal activities, unusual depression and fearfulness can indicate emotional abuse. Signs can include rocking, biting, sucking or other unusual physical symptoms.



Financial Exploitation:

Sudden changes in a person's financial condition or someone suspiciously acting on the vulnerable adult's behalf can indicate exploitation. Also look for unauthorized withdrawals using the vulnerable adult's ATM card.

Vulnerable adults are sometimes the target of abuse from their care providers who target them with physical, psychological or financial abuse. Many times the vulnerable adult feels they have no other alternative but to continue suffering at the hands of their tormentors.
